



I stumbled on to this podcast recently and have very much enjoyed the information that dispensed. The upshoot of the show is that guests from the world of Star Trek are brought on to discuss their lives with the Trek universe. Hosts of the show are Dominic Keating (the Malcolm Keating character in Star Trek: Enterprise), Conner Trinneer (who played "Trip" Tucker on ST: Enterprise), and Erica La Rose (actor, writer, and producer).





Ep.2.37 Robert Duncan McNeill

This episode was 2 hours 7 minutes long, with lots of information about the actor who played Tom Paris in Star Trek: Voyager.

Whew - Jonathon Frakes isn't the only Trek actor who went beyond just playing a characters in the Trek shows. McNeill not only started out with doing theater acting, but he used his experience

acting in theater and TV to also direct, and eventually produce TV series. His directorial debut was in an episode of ST: Voyager. He went on to do three or four episodes. Then he surprised me by saying that Tim Ross, Roxann Dawson, and Richard Picardo (Picardo did two episodes). After Voyager, McNeill directed several ST: Enterprise. Then 8/10 episodes of "Dawson Creek".

Then McNeill went on to say he produced a number of shows - The Boys, Chuck, Smash, and recurrently on SyFy's Resident Alien series.

[side note: I also picked up on a podcast called, The Deltaflyers. This one has McNeill and Garrett Wong ("Harry Kim" on the Voyager series) going through the Voyager episodes. The episodes aren't shown, but the Hosts view said episode and then provide their views and memories of what happened behind the scenes. - This podcast is seen on Patreon, but the podcast I saw was on youtube.]
